What is XTRA Weekly?

- XTRA Weekly is an interactive literacy curriculum that uses current articles from a variety of national newspapers to present topics of interest that serve as a basis for activities that engage the student and encourage development of critical-thinking skills and greater literacy.
- Lessons are based on Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts and on a higher-order thinking skills framework developed by educators at San Diego Unified School District.
- Articles and lessons are delivered each week for both Level I (designed for grades 3–5) and Level II (designed for grades 6–8).
- Step-by-step instructions guide instructors through preparation and presentation of lessons and extension activities.

Who uses XTRA Weekly?

- XTRA Weekly is geared for in-school and after-school programs serving students in grades 3–8. It can be used effectively with both small and large groups of students.

How is XTRA Weekly accessed?

- XTRA Weekly is Internet-delivered and accessible 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
- Instructors set up usernames and passwords to gain access to new lessons weekly throughout the school year.
- Articles, lessons, and instructions are provided in an attractive, easy-to-open, printable pdf format.

What do schools receive with a one-school-year subscription to XTRA Weekly?

- One-year subscription includes access to 32 weeks of lessons during the school year (mid-September through late May) at each of the two levels (64 total lessons).
- All lessons are archived throughout the school year, so the materials for any lesson from that school year can be accessed at any time before June.
- All components are labeled Level I or Level II with no grade-level designation; both levels are included with each site subscription and can be used interchangeably according to aptitudes and interests of students.
- Each lesson includes five elements (each downloadable separately to be used as best fits the needs of the individual after-school site):
 1. **Newspaper Article** – an article of current and high interest from the McClatchy-Tribune news service. All paragraphs are numbered for ease of reference by instructors and students.
 2. **Student Questions** – 5 questions designed to teach students vocabulary and higher-order thinking and reading skills.

3. **Teacher Answer Key** – contains answers to questions posed to students and cites applicable content and skill standards for each question.
4. **For The Instructor** – step-by-step directions for planning and preparing for presentation of lesson questions and extension activities, including tie-in websites, supplies needed, time requirements, and warm-up activities.
5. **Extension Activities** – a set of activities linked to the article content, geared to stimulate students to improve their literacy through writing, discussion, drawing, and other entertaining activities. Includes a weekly ELL activity and parent/guardian involvement activity.


