Previews of the impact.inspire.innovate.achieve Awards

On May 25, four amazing utilizations of technology in the learning environment will be showcased with Innovations in Education awards. Each sets a new standard in creativity, relevance and effectiveness!

impact Award

At San Onofre School at Camp Pendleton in the Fallbrook District, students produce SOSTV, a world news program viewed via the Internet. The initiative involves students in world affairs and connects them with parents serving overseas. In addition, the videoconferencing portion of the initiative enables students to interview such varied subjects as docents in Williamsburg, according to school principal Barbara Barnes.

inspire Award

Falcon Watch 2006 enables Rolling Hills Elementary students in Poway to study the behavior of nesting Peregrine falcons in real time, courtesy of webcam technology. The students not only conduct cross-curricular research on the falcons' unpredictable behavior, they also collaborate with a Columbus, Ohio class that is studying the same subject, according to teacher Lynne Harvey.

innovate Award

Podcasting is breathing life into ancient African culture and music projects developed by Sycamore Ridge School students in the Del Mar Union School District. They are developing 10-minute videos about African art and culture that are being posted on the Internet and being downloaded through iTunes to iPods and MP3 players world-wide, says teacher Jerry Foust.

achieve Award

Data-driven instruction is helping diverse students throughout the National Elementary School District become more successful in the classroom. The districtwide software tools, like SuccessMaker and their data warehouse, enable teachers to customize learning plans for each student that reflect that student's background and ability. Student standardized achievement scores are on the rise as a result of SuccessMaker, according to the district's director of technology and student assessment, Christopher Oram. �
